Plumbing Tier Program at Minuteman

The following classes follow the plumbing state curriculum and are designed to prepare you to sit for the Massachusetts State Exam for the Journeyman Plumbing License. Each tier meets the 110 hour requirement.

Plumbing Tier II Instructor: Kenneth Lay

Prerequisite: Students must have completed Tier I and OSHA (which is part of the Tier I curriculum). Students must also be working in the plumbing trade and be a registered apprentice.




